An update on attendance:

As we know, consistent attendance in school is critical for students to complete their education successfully. These absences can interfere with their ability to achieve success in learning and social development. Section 13(5) of Alberta School Act, excuses students from attending school due to illness or other unavoidable causes, religious holidays, or Board Business, such as school sports or field trips.

A change in our process will now be reflective of the School Act in regards to other absences, such as extra curricular tournaments and family holidays. These will be recorded as an unexcused absence in your child's school attendance record. The process to support learning while a student is gone will not change. We will ask that students continue to fill out an *Extended Absence Form* and teachers will work with students to allow them to complete any work missed. This change will begin starting next week- please let us know if you have any questions.
