CALM with CBe-learn online:

Registration for CALM in the KickStart session occurs between May 1 and June 4, 2018. CALM registration ends June 4th. The CALM course taken in this session will begin June 14, 2018 and must be completed by July 13, 2018. There is a cost of \$65 to take this online course as it is considered a summer school course.

Summer School:

Are you planning on attending **summer school through Chinook Learning**? Please follow these 2 important steps.

Step #1 - If you are planning on attending summer school through Chinook Learning Services, be sure to book an appointment with both with Chinook Learning Services. Visit **Chinook Learning Services.com** for appointment times and to book your appointment.

Step # 2 – Make an appointment with your HWW guidance counsellor **before** your Chinook Learning appointment. You must take a Prerequisite Information Form (PIF) signed by your guidance counsellor to your Chinook Learning Services appointment.

Are you planning on attending **online summer school through CBe-learn**?

Please see your guidance counsellor for registration and payment forms before June 18th. You need to obtain both an online summer school course registration and payment forms from your guidance counsellor. Registration ends June 18th.

Summer school dates are from July 3 – 27, 2018 for Chinook Learning, and from July 2 – 27 (one extra day with cbe-learn). Summer school courses cost \$65 plus a \$50 textbook rental fee which will be reimbursed when the textbook is returned.

GRADUATION CLOSING CEREMONIES – WEDNESDAY, MAY 23, 2018 – 9:30 A.M.

- The ceremony will be held at The Corral at Stampede Park.
- Graduands should arrive by 8:45 a.m. and be lined up in alphabetical order, in the curtained area behind the stage, by 9:00 a.m. sharp (Surname A-L on South side; M-Z on North side).
- The processional will begin promptly at 9:30 a.m.
- Tickets are not required for admission to the ceremonies. Bring as many guests as you would like.
- Graduands are required to wear their gown, stole and cap, and will **not** be permitted to walk the stage without them.

Suggested Dress

- Graduands will be wearing burgundy grad gowns.
- This is a formal event; therefore, graduands should dress accordingly. Dress pants, dress shoes, shirts, dresses, skirts, and blouses are acceptable attire. Suit jackets are discouraged as they may be too warm.
- Comfortable shoes with low heels should be worn as walking up a ramp and down the stairs will be required. Do not bring a purse or other items that need to be carried.

Grad Gowns

- Graduands must pick up their gown, stole, and cap after the grad rehearsal on **Tuesday, May 15 2018**.
- Graduands are responsible for the care and return of the gown and stole.
- Graduands are allowed to keep their caps; therefore, names should be written inside of them.
- Gowns and stoles must be returned immediately after the ceremonies have concluded (to the East end of the concourse). A teacher marshal will lead graduands to this area as part of the recessional. If the gown is not returned at the Corral at this time, the student will be responsible for paying shipping charges.
- If a graduand does not return their gown, charges will be incurred.

Pictures

- As graduands will have picked up their gowns at the rehearsal, we encourage pictures to be taken prior to the ceremonies at home or at the Corral. There will be no opportunities for pictures after the ceremonies as the gowns must be returned immediately.
- During the ceremonies, a professional Lifetouch photographer will take a picture of each graduand with Ms. Howell.
- A second picture will also be taken after each graduand exits the stage.
- Guests are not permitted to leave their seats to take pictures.

Seating

- Access to seating areas will begin at 8:45 a.m. During the ceremonies, graduands will be seated on the arena floor while guests will be seated in the stands on the sides.
- Graduands with surnames A-L will be seated on the right side facing the stage; surnames M-Z will be seated on the left side facing the stage.
- Seating for guests with limited mobility: Enter via section *North Seats 27-42* to reach this area, the first row facing the rink. This area is reserved for guests in wheelchairs and guests with limited mobility only. Due to limited seating available, only guests in wheelchairs or guests with limited mobility will be seated here with one other family member.
- Ensure all cell phones, pagers, and electronic devices are turned off during the ceremonies.
- All graduands and guests are expected to stay for the duration of the ceremony. The ceremonies will end at approximately 11:30 a.m.

Parking

- Enter from the South at 25th Avenue and 4th Street SE or from the North at Olympic Way and 14th Avenue SE.
- \$15 per single entry or \$20 for re-entry privileges on the same day. You can request and purchase the re-entry option when you first arrive in the morning.

GRADUATION BANQUET – WEDNESDAY, MAY 23, 2018 – 6:00 P.M.

- The banquet will be held at the BMO Centre (Round-up Centre) – Hall B, Stampede Park.
- Doors open at 6:00 p.m. with the programme commencing at 6:45 p.m.
- Banquet tickets are required for admittance to the event.
- All tables are reserved; absolutely no changes will be made.
- The dress code is formal/semi-formal.
- The BMO Centre is a smoke-free environment.
- The event is a school-sponsored function; therefore, alcoholic beverages are not permitted in the banquet hall.
- There are no in and out privileges for the banquet. Once you enter the hall, you will not be permitted to leave and return back into the hall. Stampede security will be at the hall doors all evening to enforce this rule.
